14 being here today.

15 Our next order of business is
16 the approval of the Journal of the

20 COUNCILMAN SQUILLA: Thank you,
21 Mr. President. I move that the Journal
22 for the meeting of Thursday,

12 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
13 ayes have it, and our Journal is
14 approved.

15 Our next order of business is
16 requests for leave of absence, and the
17 Chair recognizes Councilwoman Parker.

18 COUNCILWOMAN PARKER: Thank
19 you, Mr. President. On behalf of the
20 members of Council, there are no requests
21 for leaves of absence today.

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
23 Chair thanks the Councilwoman.

24 COUNCILMAN O'NEILL:
25 Mr. President?

8 COUNCILMAN O'NEILL: Thank you.

9 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Let
10 the record reflect that Councilman
11 O'Neill is present.

12 Thank you, Councilman.

13 The Chair now recognizes
14 Councilwoman Parker for a motion
15 concerning certain legislative matters
16 that may arise during the course of
17 today's session of Council and that were
18 not listed on the Calendar circulated
19 prior to today's session.

20 COUNCILWOMAN PARKER: Thank
21 you, Mr. President. I move that any of
22 the following matters, if considered
23 today, may be added to the agenda for
24 this session of Council and, as required
25 by law, subsequently published on an

3 those matters: resolutions authorizing

8 be voted on in this session, a motion to
9 withdraw a bill or resolution that is not
10 on the Calendar, and a motion placing a
11 bill or resolution on or returning a bill
12 or resolution from the Suspension
13 Calendar that is not listed on today's
14 Calendar.

15 The purpose of this motion is
16 to provide the public with notice
17 concerning possible actions by Council

9 Those opposed?

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
12 ayes have it. The motion carries.

13 Thank you all very much.

14 And our next order of business
15 is communications. And, Mr. Decker, will
16 you please read the messages from the
17 Mayor and any other communications that
18 you may have in your possession.

19 CHIEF CLERK: I have no
20 messages from the Mayor today,
21 Mr. President.

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

23 Short and sweet. Thank you very much.

24 And our next order of business
25 is the introduction of bills and

2 resolutions. And by way of a reminder,
3 we are asking that all resolutions,
4 including privileged resolutions, be
5 placed on the Final Passage for the next
6 session of Council, unless they are being
7 referred to committee. In our current
8 remote environment, this procedure will
9 provide the appropriate opportunity for
10 public comment.

11 I want to thank you very much
12 in advance for your anticipated
13 cooperation.

14 Mr. Decker, please read the
15 titles of the legislation that is being
16 offered today by the members.

17 CHIEF CLERK: Certainly,
18 Mr. President.

19 Councilwoman Parker offers two
20 bills and one resolution. On behalf of
21 Council President Clarke, Councilwoman
22 Parker offers an ordinance authorizing
23 the Water Commissioner, on behalf of the
24 City, to enter into an agreement between
25 the City and the Philadelphia

2 Redevelopment Authority for the
3 Philadelphia Redevelopment Authority to
4 act as the City's agent to include and
5 incorporate Philadelphia Water
6 Department-identified green stormwater
7 infrastructure projects (the "Stormwater
8 Infrastructure") in certain construction
9 and improvement projects in and around
10 the City on properties owned by the City,
11 including, with the prior written consent
12 and approval of the District Council
13 Person where the Rebuild Project is
14 located, those projects arising out of
15 the City's "Rebuilding Community
16 Infrastructure" or "Rebuild" Program, and
17 on properties owned by the Philadelphia
18 Redevelopment Authority from the design
19 phase to construction completion in an
20 efficient manner.

21 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

22 Referred to committee.

23 CHIEF CLERK: And on her own
24 behalf, an ordinance amending Title 22 of
25 The Philadelphia Code, entitled "Public

2 Employees Retirement Code," by codifying
3 the Pension Board's preexisting policy
4 and practice to perform an annual stress
5 test of the Retirement System in
6 accordance with industry standards.

7 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
8 Referred to committee.

9 CHIEF CLERK: And a resolution
10 supporting the workers of the Department
11 of Homeland Security contractor Triple
12 Canopy in their reasonable demands for
13 improved working conditions, particularly
14 their protection from hair
15 discrimination.

16 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Next
17 week's Calendar.

18 COUNCILWOMAN PARKER:
19 Mr. President, can I be recognized?

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
21 Chair recognizes Councilwoman Parker.

22 COUNCILWOMAN PARKER: Thank
23 you, Mr. President.

24 Mr. President, today I'm proud
25 to be joined by Councilmembers Katherine

2 Gilmore Richardson, Kenyatta Johnson,
3 Kendra Brooks, Bobby Henon, Derek Green,
4 Helen Gym, Allan Domb, Maria
5 Quinones-Sanchez, and Isaiah Thomas in
6 introducing this resolution supporting
7 federal armed security guards who believe
8 they have been discriminated against by
9 Triple Canopy based on race and religion.

10 These security guards say that
11 this firm, Mr. President, this federal
12 contractor, Triple Canopy, is promoting
13 an atmosphere of harassment by demanding
14 workers prove their religion and chronic
15 medical conditions every four months in
16 order to keep their facial hair.

17 Now, on March 12th, 2020, with
18 the first COVID shutdown breathing down
19 our necks, I was proud, very proud,
20 Mr. President, to join with our
21 colleagues in this body in introducing
22 legislation that has effectively become
23 known as the local version of the CROWN
24 Act.

25 Now, for those Philadelphians

2 who are watching who are saying what is
3 the CROWN Act, CROWN is an acronym that
4 stands for Creating a Respectful and Open
5 World for Natural Hair.

6 Bill No. 200252, in essence,
7 amended the Code to clarify that unlawful
8 discrimination on the basis of race
9 includes discrimination based on
10 characteristics that are commonly
11 associated with race, such as hair
12 texture and hairstyles.

13 Now, this legislation bans hair
14 discrimination in housing, employment,
15 school, competitive sports, and beyond,
16 and when this bill passed in the fall of
17 2020, Philadelphia became the first city
18 in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to
19 adopt such a law and we joined a growing
20 list of states and other jurisdictions
21 that have either introduced or adopted
22 legislation banning hair discrimination.

23 Now, these men must receive the
24 same protections and must not be
25 subjected to the discrimination that they

2 are enduring while working for this firm,
3 Triple Canopy. They cannot and should
4 not be written up and ultimately
5 terminated from employment simply for
6 exercising religious freedoms that all
7 should be accorded.

8 Many of these gentlemen are
9 veterans who have served their country
10 heroically and many of these gentlemen
11 have served on the front lines of this
12 pandemic to ensure that our government
13 can properly function.

14 They have endured mistreatment,
15 yet they continue to demonstrate their
16 patriotism by holding up their duty to
17 protect federal agencies. And despite
18 their sacrifice, Mr. President, they are
19 subjected to these discriminatory
20 practices.

21 So the resistance -- and
22 Councilmember Isaiah Thomas and I joined
23 these workers last week in protest of
24 this alleged discrimination and just
25 noted that it should not be happening at

2 the municipal level.

3 I do want to note for the
4 record that one of our congressmen, U.S.
5 Representative Dwight Evans, he is a part
6 of a coalition pushing to make this
7 legislation a reality at the federal
8 level.

9 I also want to note for the
10 record that our colleagues in the
11 Pennsylvania General Assembly, Democratic
12 Leader Joanna McClinton in the House and
13 our Senate Appropriations Chairman
14 Vincent Hughes, they are supporting
15 similar legislation at the state level.

16 Finally, Mr. President, I want
17 to say that this fight is about more than
18 just hair for someone who reduces this as
19 a conversation about hair. I don't care
20 whether it's on our head or on our face,
21 it's about our culture and it's about our
22 religion.

23 As a District Councilperson, I
24 have the great honor and privilege of
25 representing one of the largest Muslim

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2 congregations in our city at Masjidullah.

3 This is about us accepting who
4 we are and loving who we are, and no one
5 should face discrimination because they
6 are comfortable in their own skin and/or
7 religion and/or may have a medical
8 condition and they simply choose to
9 identify how they want to identify.

10 If this firm, Triple Canopy,
11 was only treating their employees
12 unfairly via harsh working conditions,
13 which quite frankly they are, we would
14 still be here today talking about this
15 issue, but the fact that they are
16 discriminating against some employees
17 based on their facial hairstyle has made
18 this fight incredibly personal to me.

19 They are violating Philadelphia
20 law, and they are violating a law that I,
21 along with our colleagues here in this
22 body, we worked hard to get passed.

23 We used this platform to shine
24 a light on this firm in the hopes that
25 they will do right by the men and women

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2 who work for them to keep our federal
3 buildings safe. I stand with the
4 workers, and I'm here to show my support
5 for them in their fight.

6 Thank you, Mr. President, and
7 thank you, colleagues.

8 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
9 Thank you, Councilwoman.

10 The Chair recognizes Councilman
11 Jones.

12 COUNCILMAN JONES: Yes. Thank
13 you, Mr. President. I want to thank my
14 colleague for moving this issue forward.

15 I want to be recorded as
16 supporting this resolution. Obviously
17 last week I was somewhat preoccupied with
18 personal matters, but I want to go on the
19 record to support it, and only ask that
20 has this also been filed with the
21 Pennsylvania Human Relations Commission
22 as an issue as well, for which I am a
23 Commissioner. I would recuse myself if I
24 needed to, but I sure hope that it's on
25 that body's radar too. This is a serious

3 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
4 Thank you. We will determine that, your
5 ability to be voting on that particular
6 issue based on your membership of that
7 body, by next week, and then we'll make
8 that known. And then being able to
9 recuse for a particular legislative
10 matter, as you know, you have to forward
11 the basis for the recusal.

12 Thank you. Thank you,
13 Councilman.

14 Thank you, Councilwoman.
15 Councilwoman Gauthier, did you
16 want to be recognized on this issue?

17 COUNCILWOMAN GAUTHIER: Thank
18 you, Council President. I wanted to be
19 on record as supporting this as well. I
20 meant to say that I wanted to co-sponsor
21 it, and I think it's a really important
22 issue and was glad to stand with the
23 workers of Triple Canopy this morning as
24 they stood against this discrimination.

25 And so thank you so much,

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2 Majority Leader Parker, for putting this
3 resolution forward.

4 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

5 Thank you. Thank you, Councilwoman.

6 As said before, that will be on
7 next week's Calendar.

11 Gilmore Richardson offers three
12 resolutions, entitled a "Resolution
13 recognizing Wednesday, October 6, 2021,
14 as Energy Efficiency Day in the City of
15 Philadelphia."

16 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Next
17 week's Calendar.

18 CHIEF CLERK: And a resolution
19 recognizing and congratulating Erin
20 O'Brien-Hofmann for receiving a 2021
21 Tradeswomen Heroes Award from the
22 National Association of Building Trades
23 Unions.

24 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Next
25 week's Calendar.

8 CHIEF CLERK: Councilwoman Gym
9 offers two resolutions, entitled a
10 "Resolution authorizing the City Council
11 Committees on Children & Youth and
12 Education to hold public hearings on the
13 search and hiring process for the next
14 Superintendent of the School District of
15 Philadelphia, and the role that the
16 perspectives of families, students,
17 teachers, school administrators,
18 paraprofessionals, support staff, and
19 community members must play throughout
20 the search process."

21 Mr. President, Councilwoman
22 Gym --

23 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
24 Councilwoman, did you need to be
25 recognized on this or your Haitian

3 COUNCILWOMAN GYM: I'm going to
4 be very brief on this one, Council
5 President, if I may.

6 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Yes.

7 COUNCILWOMAN GYM: Thank you so
8 much. So I will reserve my comments
9 about the substance of the resolution
10 until a later time, but I did want to
11 inform my colleagues that out of respect
12 for requests that were made by the Chair
13 of the Education Committee, we're going
14 to hold the vote on this resolution. We
15 had to introduce it, but we're going to
16 hold the vote on it and will not move the
17 vote forward today.

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
19 Okay. We just won't proceed with the
20 resolution today then. Because it's a
21 request for a hearing, it traditionally
22 requires a vote on that particular day,
23 according to our rules. So we'll just
24 hold that today.

25 Go ahead, Mr. --

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2 COUNCILWOMAN GYM: Okay. I

3 thought Mr. Decker said that we could --

4 well, anyway, I'm fine either way, but we

5 just wanted to make that clear.

6 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: If

7 we're not going to vote for a hearing

8 request, then we might as well just hold

9 the resolution.

10 CHIEF CLERK: So it will just

11 go on the Calendar, Mr. President.

12 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Yes.

13 Correct. All right.

14 COUNCILWOMAN GYM: Thank you.

15 CHIEF CLERK: And a resolution

16 condemning the inhumane treatment of

17 Haitian migrants at the border and urging

18 the Biden administration to immediately

19 suspend all deportations of Haitians,

20 expedite the release of Haitian

21 immigrants held in U.S. immigration

22 facilities, uphold the right to seek

23 asylum, and ensure a clean pathway to

24 citizenship for essential workers,

25 Dreamers, Temporary Protected Status

2 holders, and their families in all
3 economic recovery legislation including
4 through budget reconciliation.

5 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: And
6 the Chair recognizes Councilwoman Gym.

7 COUNCILWOMAN GYM: Thank you so
8 much, Council President.

9 First, I want to acknowledge
10 the leadership of my co-introducer for
11 this resolution, Councilmember Johnson,
12 and thank the co-sponsors of this
13 resolution, Councilmembers
14 Quinones-Sanchez, Green, Parker, Gilmore
15 Richardson, Gauthier, Brooks, Domb,
16 Thomas, and Jones.

17 This week alone there were two
18 demonstrations by -- demonstrating the
19 power and breadth of the Haitian
20 community that lives here in
21 Philadelphia, that has brought vibrancy
22 to our neighborhoods and communities, and
23 have long been economic drivers here in
24 our city.

25 There's no question that the

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2 shocking abuse that we witnessed over the
3 past few weeks mobilized people to action
4 and reminded us once again that the
5 United States' central failure to pass
6 immigration reform -- and failing to do
7 it for more than 35 years, more than
8 35 years; more than three decades have
9 passed since a massive effort at
10 citizenship expansion has occurred in our
11 city -- has not only dragged down the --
12 has not only harmed the lives and the
13 rights of migrants, asylum seekers,
14 refugees, and immigrants, but has
15 violated the central principles of what
16 it means to be an American.

17 Seeking asylum is legal,
18 period. The treatment of migrants
19 crossing the U.S.-Mexico border has been
20 inhumane and deplorable for decades, and
21 what we saw from the shocking abuse of
22 Haitian migrants at our border has also
23 its roots in decades of failure and in
24 particular the targeting of Haitian
25 migrants and immigrants for decades.

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2 There should be no question
3 that Haitian migrants seeking asylum in
4 the U.S. have faced repeatedly inhumane
5 and unequal treatment. They were falsely
6 reclassified as economic migrants rather
7 than refugees in the 1970s to deny them
8 the right to seek asylum in the U.S.

9 They suffered detention in
10 Guantanamo Bay during the 1990s, and
11 there have been many more abuses to an
12 important, important global neighbor of
13 the U.S.

14 What is particularly egregious
15 is that the Biden administration has been
16 deploying a tactic utilized by the Trump
17 administration that has just made no
18 sense, as is the Title 42 policy, talking
19 about COVID virus. And under that
20 pretext, they have thus moved to expel
21 all migrants, 14,000 of them, from an
22 encampment, deporting over 2,000 Haitians
23 and many more into detention centers for
24 processing. And UNICEF estimates that
25 over two-thirds of those deported Haitian

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2 migrants are women and children,
3 including newborn infants.

4 So there's no question why the
5 Haitian community and other communities
6 across the City joined together this week
7 to demand an absolute end to the abusive
8 and inhumane treatment of Haitian
9 migrants at the border.

10 But we are very clear. Now is
11 the time for the U.S. to push on a clean
12 pathway to citizenship. We have 11
13 million undocumented workers in the
14 United States. We've got many more here
15 in the City of Philadelphia and across
16 the State of Pennsylvania.

17 Our city's future, our state's
18 future, and our nation's future relies on
19 humanity and common sense and a
20 purposeful path towards citizenship for
21 all. And we'll be moving this resolution
22 forward.

23 And I thank you for the
24 opportunity to make those remarks. Thank
25 you, Council President.

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2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

3 Thank you, Councilwoman.

4 That will be on today's

5 Calendar.

6 CHIEF CLERK: Councilman Henon

7 offers --

8 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: I'm

9 sorry. Say that again, Mr. Decker.

3 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

4 Those three bills will be referred to the
5 appropriate committee.

6 CHIEF CLERK: And an ordinance

8 to enter into a contract for the
9 construction of a water main and
10 appurtenant work, required to provide
11 public water service, in the 4000 block
12 of Wells Street and the 6600 block of
13 Charles Street; and

14 An ordinance amending Chapter
15 9-4400 of The Philadelphia Code, entitled
16 "Responsible Business Operations," to
17 expand property owner liability.

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

19 Again, those will be referred to the
20 appropriate committee.

21 CHIEF CLERK: Councilman Jones
22 offers one resolution, entitled a
23 "Resolution also naming the 5200 block of
24 West Berks Street as 'Charles 'Chucky'
25 Rainey, Jr., Way,' in honor of Charles

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2 Rainey, Jr., to commemorate his legacy as
3 the 'Ambassador of Wynnefield' and
4 long-time dedication to the residents of
5 the Wynnefield neighborhood of
6 Philadelphia."

7 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Next
8 week's Calendar.

9 CHIEF CLERK: Councilwoman
10 Sanchez offers one resolution authorizing
11 the Committee on Housing, Neighborhood
12 Development, and the Homeless to conduct
13 hearings regarding the provision of
14 Emergency Housing Vouchers for

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

9 amending Chapter 9-200 of Title 9 of The
10 Philadelphia Code, entitled 'Commercial
11 Activities on Streets,' to add a new
12 section entitled 'Streeteries' to allow
13 for expansion of business uses, including
14 outdoor dining, in portions of the public
15 right-of-way, such as at certain curbside
16 parking locations."

17 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
18 Chair recognizes Councilman Domb.

19 COUNCILMAN DOMB: Thank you,
20 Council President. Good morning.

21 Thank you, colleagues, for the
22 opportunity to speak today about the two
23 bills I'm introducing that would create a
24 citywide process for permanent licensing
25 of outdoor dining spaces on our sidewalks

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2 and on our streets across the City of
3 Philadelphia.

4 With the emergency approvals
5 expiring at the end of this year, 2021,
6 we need to establish legislation that
7 would continue this great city amenity
8 that we've enjoyed as a result of the
9 pandemic.

10 Restaurants of all sizes all
11 over the City in every neighborhood have
12 utilized this opportunity, and because of
13 it, they were able to keep their doors
14 open, keeping employees working in the
15 hospitality industry, all while
16 continuing to overcome the tremendous
17 challenges of the pandemic and still
18 maintaining a safe and healthy
19 environment.

20 I've spoken with many of you
21 about how we can work to expand usage,
22 especially to our corridors outside of
23 Center City in all the neighborhoods, and
24 use these restaurants as anchoring
25 businesses and creating exciting spaces

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2 for our residents.

3 These bills would amend our
4 Code regulating sidewalk cafes and
5 commercial activities on streets by
6 providing an equal opportunity for
7 restaurants to participate in outdoor
8 dining options citywide while creating a
9 greater level of safety, accountability,
10 transparency, and enforcement through a
11 permanent licensing option.

12 This would include requiring
13 all applicants to publicly post their
14 application for a sidewalk cafe or
15 streeteries for at least ten days in order
16 to obtain the license. Public
17 notification gives citizens, neighborhood
18 organizations, and Councilmembers an
19 opportunity to relay any concern to the
20 Streets Department and L&I prior to a
21 decision on the license.

22 The legislation also addresses
23 public safety, traffic flow, transit
24 needs, and bike lanes for all
25 streeteries, providing guidance for the

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2 Streets Department and L&I to enforce as
3 needed.

4 Along with providing
5 accountability and enforcement tools,
6 these bills will provide the City with
7 the authority to remove any structure
8 that is not up to code and/or is not
9 being used as a streetery or sidewalk
10 capping space.

11 These bills were developed in
12 close coordination with the
13 Administration, the Pennsylvania
14 Restaurant Lodging Association, the
15 business improvement districts and
16 business corridors throughout the City,
17 disability advocates, civic associations,
18 and other stakeholders.

19 I want to thank everyone,
20 especially my colleagues. I've spoken to
21 almost all of you about this bill. I
22 want to thank you for your input,
23 support, and for your work to help our
24 businesses thrive as our city makes its
25 way back.

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2 I look forward to discussing
3 these bills in the committee, and I
4 welcome you all to join me any time for
5 dinner anywhere and everywhere all over
6 the City. I think it's exciting, and
7 it's a way that makes us different having
8 this outdoor dining.

9 So I will look forward to
10 working with everyone, and I appreciate
11 the time.

12 Thank you, Council President.

13 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

14 Thank you, Councilman.

15 Mr. Decker, just read the
16 second bill.

17 CHIEF CLERK: Councilman Domb
18 also offers an ordinance amending Chapter
19 9-208 of Title 9 of The Philadelphia
20 Code, entitled "Sidewalk Cafes," to
21 revise standards and requirements
22 associated with sidewalk cafes.

23 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

24 Thank you. Those two bills will be
25 referred to the appropriate committee.

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
12 Councilwoman, you wanted to be

14 COUNCILWOMAN GAUTHIER: Yes,
15 please.

16 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: The
17 Chair -- thank you. The Chair recognizes
18 Councilwoman Gauthier.

19 COUNCILWOMAN GAUTHIER: Thank
20 you, Council President.

21 I just wanted to take a moment
22 to personally congratulate the Penn
23 Alexander School community on being
24 recognized as a Blue Ribbon School. This
25 is a national distinction among both

2 public and private schools in our
3 country. Only 300 schools receive this
4 designation nationally and only two in
5 Philadelphia this year, Penn Alexander
6 and GAMP.

7 And I think the distinction
8 means even more because last year was
9 such a hard year, going through a global
10 pandemic and having students try to learn
11 at the same time.

12 And so congratulations to the
13 principal, the teachers, the staff, the
14 parents and, most especially, the
15 students. I'm so proud of all of you,
16 and I'm very proud to have such a
17 high-quality school in the Third
18 District.

19 Thank you so much.

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

21 Thank you, Councilwoman.

22 That will be on next week's

24 CHIEF CLERK: Councilman Thomas
25 offers one resolution, entitled a

24 Under ideal conditions, we will
25 have three minutes for each speaker.

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2 Today we meet that threshold, so you will
3 have three minutes for your testimony
4 today.

5 In order to be fair to those
6 wishing to speak, I intend to hold
7 faithfully to the established time limit.
8 Once invited to the meeting and asked to
9 begin your testimony, a timer will be
10 started. We will monitor your remaining
11 time throughout your testimony, and when
12 there are 30 seconds remaining to your
13 time, you will be reminded of this. Once
14 your allotted time has passed, you will
15 be asked to conclude your remarks, and
16 shortly thereafter you will be muted and
17 disconnected from the remote meeting.

18 I also reserve the right to
19 limit the number of speakers where
20 repetitious comments are being made on
21 the same subject matter and to limit the
22 scope of the testimony to only certain
23 items on the agenda during the emergency,
24 which could affect callbacks for public
25 comment at the meeting.

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2 Please be aware that this
3 public meeting is being recorded, and
4 because the meeting is public,
5 participants and viewers have no
6 reasonable expectation of privacy. So by
7 continuing to be in the meeting, you are
8 consenting to being recorded.

9 I want to thank you all very

12 I will now ask Mr. Decker to

16 we have for today, Mr. President, is
17 Keyona Montgomery, commenting on 210761.

18 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good
19 morning. State your name for the record
20 and please proceed with your testimony.

21 MS. MONTGOMERY: Yes. Good
22 morning. My name is Keyona Montgomery.
23 I'm here to talk on behalf of naming -- I
24 mean, the resolution that's in hand.

25 Could I continue? I'm sorry.

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2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Yes,
3 please. Proceed.

4 MS. MONTGOMERY: Oh, okay.

5 Yeah. I just wanted to witness -- I
6 wanted to come and talk on behalf of
7 naming the Rasheed Wallace Way because of
8 the legacy and the detail in regards to
9 what Rasheed pretty much gives back in
10 regards to the community.

11 His community initiative, not
12 only does it branch from here to
13 Philadelphia, but it reaches outside of
14 Philadelphia, from Detroit to North
15 Carolina, now also in Tennessee.

16 Rasheed has been giving back to
17 the community for over two decades now,
18 and I would -- you know, within this last
19 year or two, I've been by his side seeing
20 what he did to the community.

21 He gives resources. I've seen
22 him pay out his own pocket in regards to
23 providing resources for our community
24 here in Philadelphia. Like I said, over
25 20 years he's been providing community

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2 outreach stuff for the community of
3 Philadelphia, giving free basketball
4 camps out to the community of
5 Philadelphia, giving free food, free
6 sneakers. And not to top it off with
7 that he's a legend. The work that he's
8 done on the court as well as off the
9 court is unnoted.

10 I just want to give his flowers
11 while he's here in regards to the legacy
12 so that the community of Philadelphia
13 know who he is and continue to remember
14 who he is and what he do for our
15 community.

16 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:
17 Thank you very much for your testimony.
18 We appreciate it.

19 Next speaker.

20 CHIEF CLERK: Tiffany Green,
21 commenting on 210474-AA.

22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good
23 morning. State your name for the record
24 and proceed with your testimony.

25 MS. GREEN: Hello?

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2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Good
3 morning. State your name for the record
4 and proceed with your testimony, please.

5 MS. GREEN: Oh, did you call?
6 Is this Tiffany Green?

7 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE: Yes.

8 MS. GREEN: I'm sorry. I
9 didn't hear my name being called.

10 I'm speaking on Bill 210474-A.
11 I wanted to speak -- I don't -- I want to
12 speak on this bill because of the fact
13 that although I did have a chance to
14 connect with Councilwoman Sanchez, and I
15 appreciate her talking with me and we did
16 talk about working together and with some
17 of the other RCOs to really hear our
18 voice, I still do not support the bill
19 being passed today as it currently
20 stands.

21 I feel this bill has been
22 introduced since June, and I don't
23 understand why the community process just
24 can't be put into the bill.

25 I mean, I simply think that we

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2 should just take a note from you, Council
3 President, where you put in your own
4 preservation bill for your particular
5 area where you have one sentence that
6 states, floor, height, and density
7 bonuses not permitted in Strawberry
8 Mansion.

9 I think that we could amend
10 this right now on the floor if you really
11 care about the community and put in there
12 that floor, height, and density bonus is
13 not permitted unless we meet with the
14 community and have an RCO process. It's
15 as simple as that if you really want to
16 have inclusion.

17 You can't have an inclusionary
18 bill and not include the community. I
19 just don't understand, because the
20 problem is is that we have to wait and
21 many developers start to rush and push
22 through their projects because they feel
23 that this bill may be changed down the
24 road, and so we have -- we wind up with
25 development that we really don't have a

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2 say in.

3 Secondly, we don't want to have
4 by-rights, because like we had a
5 developer this past zoning meeting tell
6 us, well, I'm working with you, but I
7 really don't have to come in front of you
8 because I can do this as a matter of
9 right and I don't have to really come
10 back in front of the community. And that
11 is really chilling to a lot of
12 particularly residents in the community
13 who are already frightened by this new
14 development. And to have developers talk
15 to you in that manner, it is really
16 degrading and really -- it takes away
17 your power within your own community.

18 So I think that in order to
19 make the community feel that they're
20 really a part of this inclusionary theme,
21 then we should have that community
22 process.

23 We can't wait for area by area.
24 We cannot wait. Developers are coming
25 through every day to develop, and at this

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2 point, what are we getting for the
3 ten-year tax abatement? I mean, why are
4 these bonuses even an issue at this point
5 in terms of seven feet, height, floor,
6 all these additional market-rate
7 apartments? I mean, at this particular
8 point, you're getting a ten-year tax
9 abatement. What are we getting in terms
10 of that? I mean, the City is making
11 money off the transfer taxes, of course,
12 and we don't even hear about where that
13 money is going to. However, at this
14 point, why do we have to keep giving
15 additional bonuses?

16 So that's why it's important
17 that this bill really be brought back to
18 the Rules Committee and have a discussion
19 about it and really address this, but I
20 would like to see this community process
21 amended today on the floor and really
22 giving power back to the community.

23 I think that that's the way to
24 go.

25 COUNCILWOMAN PARKER: Thank

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2 you, Tiffany, for your testimony today.

3 We greatly appreciate it.

4 Mr. Chief Clerk, I would ask
5 that you please read the name of our next
6 speaker.

7 CHIEF CLERK: Yes, Madam Chair.

8 The next speaker is Susan Nam,
9 commenting on 210760.

10 COUNCILWOMAN PARKER: Ms. Nam,
11 are you connected?

12 MS. NAM: Yes. Hi. I'm here
13 to --

14 COUNCILWOMAN PARKER: Excuse
15 me, Ms. Nam? Yes. Please --

16 MS. NAM: Yes.

17 COUNCILWOMAN PARKER: Please
18 state your name for the record and
19 proceed with your comments.

20 MS. NAM: My name is Susan Nam
21 and I'm here to oppose Bill No. 210760
22 due to the unclear and obscure nature of
23 the bill. It has no language or
24 direction as to where all these blocks
25 listed are being disposed to. How do we

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2 ensure that these too will not end in up
3 the hands of private developers?

4 Also, I want to address last
5 week's out-of-turn Council speeches in
6 response to my public comment regarding
7 the opposition of Councilmember Gym's
8 Bill 210697 that Council President had to
9 rescind three times. How quickly Council
10 felt the need to clarify and label a
11 constituent's testimony as
12 misinformation. By insinuating ideas by
13 putting words in my mouth was not only
14 inappropriate and unwarranted, but
15 irresponsible democracy.

16 I refuse to be patronized and
17 shame on you-ed by my own elected
18 officials in a public forum no less for
19 voicing an opinion that knowingly was not
20 going to be asked further to elaborate on
21 and was completely assumed into.

22 These dangerous, one-conclusion
23 assumptions disable us from looking at
24 these impertinent issues empirically.
25 Ironically, instead it revealed the

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2 hidden hypocritical biases and intolerant
3 nature of these agendas.

4 To further address the rebuttal
5 to my testimony, as if it were a careless
6 and uneducated one, was actually a
7 healthy culmination of thoughts over a
8 lifetime of work from a spectrum of
9 countless conversations and unbiased
10 research from those like-minded and not,
11 but always civil, thoughtful, and every
12 side something to be learned from.

13 Need we be reminded the very
14 purpose of why these windows of public
15 comments not only exist but are
16 absolutely necessary is to disrupt this
17 echo chamber culture of media and
18 politics.

19 Let us remember the real
20 freedom that we are either always
21 defending or fighting for live in our
22 diversity in schools of thoughts, ideas,
23 and discussions.

24 Thank you, Council President.

25 COUNCILWOMAN PARKER: Thank you

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2 so very much for your comments today.

3 I would ask the Chief Clerk to
4 please read the name of our next speaker.

5 CHIEF CLERK: The next speaker
6 is Linda Bell, commenting on 210549.

7 COUNCILWOMAN PARKER: Good
8 morning, Mrs. Bell. Are you connected
9 and ready to proceed?

10 MS. BELL: Yes, I am.

11 COUNCILWOMAN PARKER:
12 Mrs. Bell, please --

13 MS. BELL: Can you hear me?

14 COUNCILWOMAN PARKER: Yes, I
15 can hear you well. Please state your
16 name for the record and then proceed with
17 your comments.

18 MS. BELL: My name is Linda
19 Bell, CPI alum, and I support the
20 following bills and resolutions: 210434,
21 210636, and Resolution 210396, with which
22 I would encourage Councilmember Parker
23 and this Council to expand this
24 resolution to say until which time a
25 bailout bill can be formulated to forgive

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2 those mortgages and tax foreclosures.

3 It's time for the citizens of

4 Philadelphia to get their turn to receive

5 a bailout bonus.

6 Speaking of bonuses, I join

7 Tiffany and those who oppose Bill No.

8 210474-A, because this and bills like it

9 directly contribute to the violence,

10 crime, and growing homeless population by

11 funding existing single-family homes into

12 perpetual darkness with their height

13 extensions and density allowance in

14 already dense areas, creating a higher

15 potential for physical and mental illness

16 in existing populations by severely

17 decreasing their quality of life, forcing

18 those who can move, to sell or lose their

19 homes to the very predators that cause

20 the situation for a fraction of the value

21 of their home, supported by the very body

22 that they elected to represent and

23 protect their interests.

24 Which brings me to state my

25 opposition to Resolution 210759, 210760

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2 to stop this blatant transfer of the
3 people's wealth of public and private
4 land in the form of land deed transfers
5 to the Philadelphia Land Bank for cheap,
6 easy access to developers, robbing us of
7 financial compensation from the wealthy
8 and placing an eventual increased tax
9 burden for the residents of the poorest
10 city of the top five major cities in the
11 country with tax abatements for these
12 developers.

13 My final opposition is to
14 Ordinance 210205. Without further
15 clarification as to how this would be
16 implemented to protect the homeowner and
17 their right to possession, it reads as
18 another way to rob residents of their
19 property and general wealth.

20 And I would like to support
21 Susan Nam and her comment on City Council
22 and their treatment of her and others
23 like us to stand up and speak for our
24 people. I speak for myself on behalf of
25 those who cannot speak for themselves for

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2 whatever reason created by these
3 circumstances.

4 These practices must stop.
5 Another way must be made to create a
6 win-win living situation for all.

7 Thank you.

8 COUNCILWOMAN PARKER: Thank you
9 so very much for your comments today.

10 Mr. Decker, can you please read

9 International Underground Railroad Month,
10 which honors the history of
11 freedom-seekers in our country and around
12 the world.

13 September was chosen to
14 represent this occasion because it was
15 the month that two of the most well-known
16 Underground Railroad operatives,
17 Frederick Douglass and Harriet Tubman,
18 escaped from slavery.

19 The Underground Railroad was a
20 key effort that undermined the
21 institution of slavery in our country and
22 provided a pathway to freedom for as many
23 as 100,000 men, women, and children.

24 And it's of special
25 significance for our state and our city.

1 9/30/21 - STATED - 2ND READING

2 Pennsylvania was the first state to
3 abolish slavery, and so the Commonwealth
4 played a crucial, strategic role in the
5 Underground Railroad, offering many entry
6 points to freedom.

7 Philadelphia too has a storied
8 history connected to the Underground
9 Railroad. Many sites like Belmont
10 Mansion, Fairhill Cemetery, Mother Bethel
11 AME Church, and Independence National
12 Historic Park are connected to the
13 Underground Railroad, with many of those
14 sites serving as havens for fleeing
15 enslaved people.

16 The City was home to many
17 prominent abolitionists and anti-slavery
18 activists, including William Still, who
19 was often referred to as the Father of
20 Underground Railroad and who directly
21 aided over 800 fugitive slaves in their
22 pursuit of freedom. This year marks the
23 200th anniversary of Mr. Still's birth.

24 It was important to me to
25 introduce this resolution because of how

2 relevant the Underground Railroad and the
3 efforts of its organizers remain today.

4 It was a testament to the spirit and
5 ingenuity of Black people, and it was
6 also a massive undertaking that involved
7 people of all cultural backgrounds

9 goal. And, most of all, the Underground
10 Railroad reflects our fundamental desire
11 and our right to be free.

12 This is an opportunity to honor
13 those who pursued their freedom by
14 traveling the Underground Railroad, to
15 express gratitude to those who aided them
16 on their journey, and to remind all of us
17 that the fight for freedom for all people
18 is still being fought all around the
19 world.

20 Thank you so much.

10 commitment, a sense of responsibility,
11 and an appreciation for all that has gone
12 into getting us to this point.

13 Again, I want to thank the
14 Administration. I want to thank my
15 colleagues. I want to thank the
16 advocates that have fought so hard for
17 this. And now the most important part is
18 to fill those slots so that we can make
19 sure that when it comes to police
20 involvement and oversight and community
21 policing, that it has an opportunity to
22 be done with a diversity that reflects
23 the City, a demographic diversity but
24 also a geographic diversity.

3 Thank you, Councilman.

4 The Chair recognizes Councilman
5 Johnson.

6 COUNCILMAN JOHNSON: Thank you,
7 Council President. I know myself and you
8 have been up all last night and other
9 Councilmembers even the night before, all
10 of us just wrapping our heads around the
11 senseless gun violence that we're seeing
12 here in the City of Philadelphia. Beyond
13 passing that 400 milestone, which we did
14 last year at this particular time, it's
15 just a stark reminder of how much work
16 that we have to do in front of us.

17 I make no qualms about calling
18 for justice for all of the homicide
19 victims here in the City of Philadelphia.
20 I'm calling for swift justice with
21 arrests and prosecution of those
22 individuals who have taken the life of a
23 young lady and shot two other young
24 ladies in the car as well as a
25 13-year-old yesterday, the young men who

2 were shot inside a corner store. It just
3 shows that no one is safe here in the
4 City of Philadelphia.

5 I go to the corner store on a
6 day-to-day basis, so that means I'm
7 subjected to the same level of violence
8 that we're seeing taking place all across
9 the City of Philadelphia.

10 So just a reminder of how
11 serious this issue is, and we will all
12 continue to keep working together to wrap
13 our arms around this particular issue
14 but, most importantly, support those
15 families who have lost loved ones to gun
16 violence.

17 I know in the next couple of
18 weeks we will be reconvening our Special
19 Committee on Gun Violence hearings just
20 to make sure that there's a level of
21 transparency and accountability for all
22 the agencies that are responsible to be
23 addressing this issue, but making sure
24 also we're looking at all the best ideas
25 and recommendations to make sure we

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2 reduce this tide of senseless gun
3 violence that we're seeing taking place
4 in our city right now.

5 We're in a dark space, very,
6 very dark space. We were here last year,
7 but nevertheless, it seems like day in
8 and day out the types of shootings that
9 we are seeing become more and more
10 devastating. And each time you have
11 children and women -- and I come from an
12 environment where children and women were
13 off limits, right -- that just shows the
14 level of lawlessness that we are facing
15 right now, and I honestly believe that
16 the leadership here in the City of
17 Philadelphia need to respond accordingly.
18 And so if those who carry guns don't
19 respect the public, then we have to
20 respond accordingly.

21 So I'mma stand on that and
22 I'mma continue doing all the other work
23 that we have been doing in terms of
24 violence prevention and boots on the
25 ground types of support, but at the end

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2 of the day, you carry a gun, you got to
3 go. It's real, real simple.

4 And unless you experience a
5 level of gun violence in your own family,
6 you may look at it a totally different
7 way, but I'm quite sure that all of the
8 members of this Council feel the sense of
9 urgency and compassion for those families
10 that we are reaching out to and trying to
11 support that have lost loved ones to gun
12 violence.

13 So I just wanted to put that
14 out there, because that's where my head
15 is at. I know all of my colleagues'
16 heads are in the same place, because I
17 have talked to a variety of you in a
18 variety of different conversations around
19 what we're experiencing.

20 And so with that being said,
21 thank you, Council President.

22 I just also want to follow up
23 on the resolution that was introduced
24 regarding my brothers and sisters from
25 Haiti and just making sure that they

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2 receive the type of support that they
3 need for a pathway to citizenship here in
4 the United States. And hopefully with
5 the resolution that will be voted on and
6 confirmed next week, that the powers that
7 be in Washington, DC are paying attention
8 to the City of Philadelphia.

9 Thank you very much, Council
10 President.

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT CLARKE:

12 Thank you, Councilman.

13 I'm not allowed to give
14 speeches, so I won't do that, but I'll
15 just say I concur. I'll leave it at
16 that, but there will be future
17 conversations outside of this particular
18 format about where we need to go and who
19 needs to be ultimately the people that
20 need to take us there. So thank you very
21 much.
